



Report on College Campus Cleanliness Drive under "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" organized by N55 Units, Government Degree College Kangan.

On 2nd August 2025 as a part of the Independence Day celebrations and in alignment with the objectives of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, the NSS units of Government Degree College (GDC) Kangan organized a Campus Cleanliness Drive. 








Report on Waterbody Cleanliness Drive under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan for the 79thIndependence Day Celebrations


On 6 August, 2025 student-volunteers along with NSS Program Officers, Eco Club, and the Department of Environmental Science of Government Degree College (GDC) Kangan organized a water body cleanliness drive along sections of the Sindh River adjacent to the college campus. This initiative was strategically timed ahead of 15 August, promoting the ideals of a "Clean and Healthy India" under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan-reflecting national pride and environmental stewardship. The objectives of the drive was to remove accumulated non-biodegradable waste (plastic bottles, wrappers, polythene bags, packaging materials) from riverbanks and nearby stretches and to promote waste segregation on-site-sorting recyclables separately from general waste. The drive also aimed to raise awareness among local residents and passersby about the significance of keeping local water bodies free from pollution and to instil values of community service and environmental responsibility in students and faculty. Volunteers were organized into teams-some cleaned the riverbanks and nearby pathways, while others managed waste segregation. An estimated 80-100 kgs of waste was collected including plastic bottles, food wrappers, polythene bags, and other litter. Recyclables were separated and stored for proper recycling, while residual waste was disposed of safely. The local residents appreciated the effort; some joined and pledged to avoid littering the river. The drive throughly enhanced a sense of civic duty, environmental awareness, and teamwork. It was a well-coordinated drive involving effective waste collection and segregation process successful in disseminating the message of environmental upkeep tied to national pride around Independence Day. By combining waste collection, segregation, and environmental advocacy, the college reaffirmed its commitment to a clean, healthy, and sustainable India.


