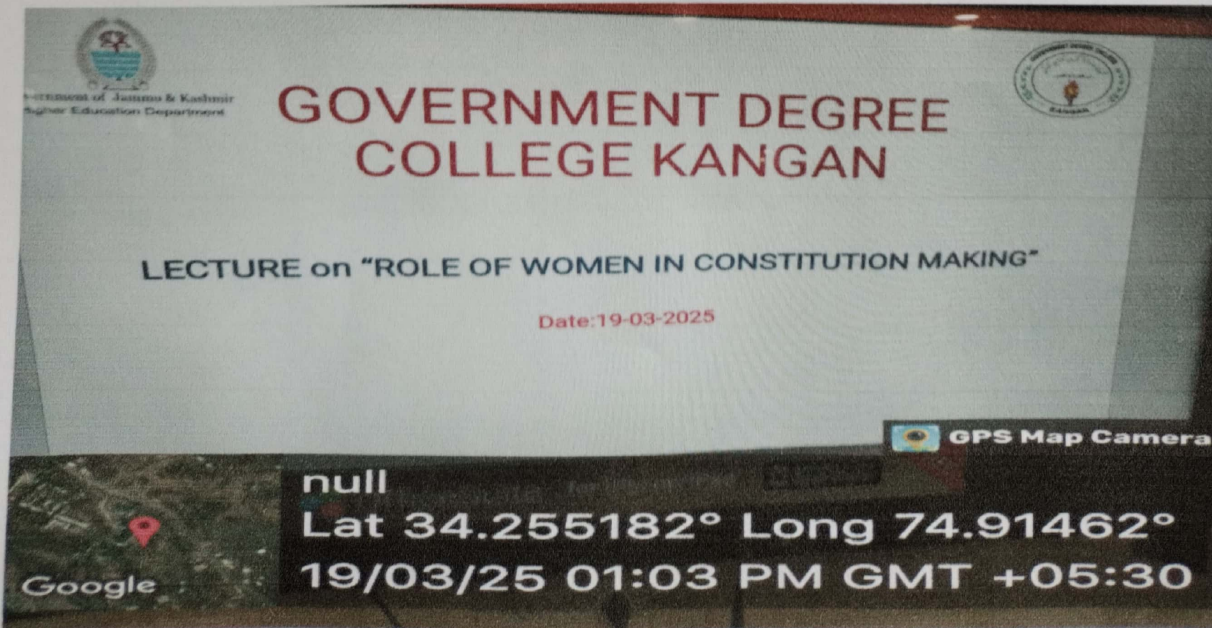

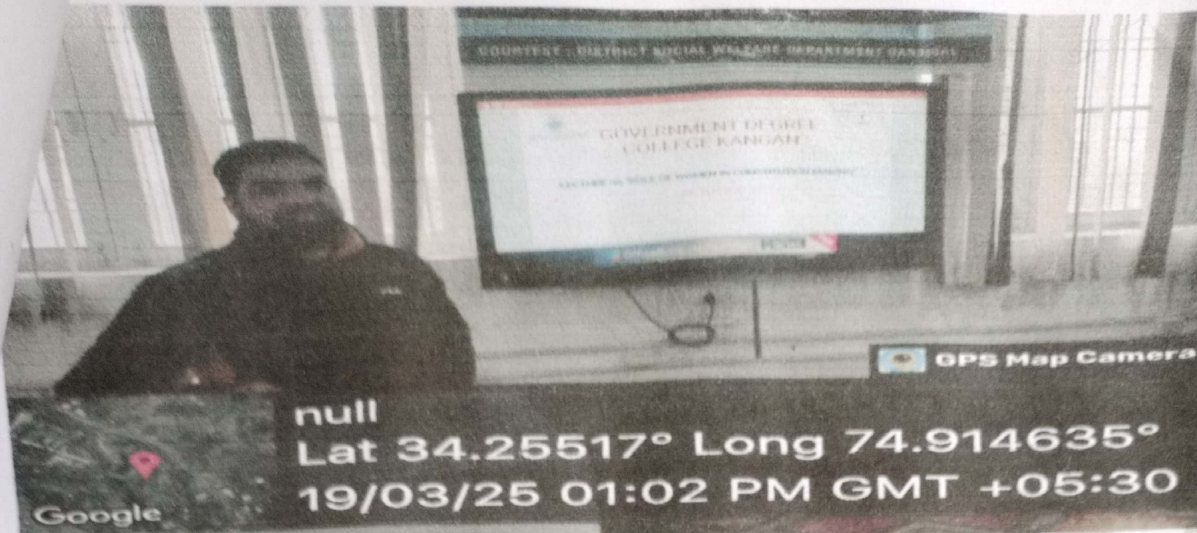

Report on Role of Women in Constitution Making

As part of Celebration of 75 Years of Adoption of Constitution of India and 150th Birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhai Patel, Department of Political Science Government Degree College Kangan organised a Lecture on “**Role of Women in Constitution Making**” on 15-03-2025. The main purpose of the lecture was to educate students about the significant contributions of women in shaping the Indian Constitution. The lecture was delivered by Dr Mohammad Ishaq khanday Lecturer Department of Political Science. The speaker began by discussing the social and political landscape of India during the period leading up to the framing of the Constitution. Women, though initially excluded from formal political roles, were instrumental in the independence movement and began to demand equal rights. The speaker emphasized the importance of the freedom struggle in empowering women to actively participate in political and constitutional processes. The speaker concluded the lecture by discussing the lasting legacy of the women who contributed to the Indian Constitution. Their efforts ensured that women’s rights were enshrined in the Constitution, and their influence can be seen in the legal and political advancements made for women in India over the years.
